On a motion made by Mr. Hart and seconded by Ms. Major, the Board of Supervisors voted to continue the appointment to its November meeting.

10.2 October Attendance Report

There was no discussion on this matter.

11. <u>Public Hearing (6:30)</u>

Public Hearing Rules were read by Mrs. Burge.

11.1 Public Hearing on REZ-2018-001 to rezone Tax Map #102C-1-A (Tom Schwartz) and 102C-1-B (Donald Fitchett) from Industrial to Agricultural

Mr. Morrison and Mrs. Nunez gave a presentation and explained that Mr. Tom Schwartz filed an application to rezone Tax Map #102C-1-A2 and was joined by the neighboring parcel owner, Donald Fitchett, to also rezone Tax Map #102C-1-B from Industrial to Agricultural. The rezoning of these two parcels (totaling 33 acres) is not out of character for the surrounding neighborhood. While they were originally zoned Industrial to accommodate the expansion of the Airport Business Park, more agricultural growth has occurred in the surrounding area. These two parcels continue to be used in an agricultural manner.

Chairman Crockett opened the public hearing. No one signed up or requested to speak. Mr. Crockett closed the public hearing.

Mr. Schwartz appeared before the Board to review the request and thanked staff for all of their assistance through the process.

On a motion made by Mr. Hart and seconded by Mr. Muhly the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve rezoning application #REZ-2018-001 filed by Tom Schwartz and Donald Fitchett for the property located at Tax Map #102C-1-A2 & 102C-1-B, Airport Drive, Melfa, VA. from Industrial to Agricultural as

recommended by the Planning Commission with the following supportive reasoning:

- 1. The Planning Commission has recommended approval of the rezoning requests.
- 2. The Executive Summary of the Comprehensive Plan emphasizes the need for economic development in the agricultural industry. Parcel 102C-1-A2 is utilized for equine training and parcel 102C-1-B is actively cultivated.
- 3. Chapter 3 of the Comprehensive Plan states that Accomack County's economy is based primarily on agriculture, manufacturing, services, and public administration. There is a residential component to the Schwartz parcel which is not compatible to the Industrial zoning. The Comprehensive Plan supports Agriculture, which does have a residential component to it.
- 4. The Comprehensive Plan designation of Industrial was established in at least 1997. At the current time, there is an adequate supply of industrially zoned land in the Industrial Park that is served by sewer and water and no apparent market demand for Industrial property in the Melfa area outside of the Industrial Park.

11.2 Public Hearing on the Comprehensive Plan Review and Update

Mr. Morrison informed the Board that work on the 5-year required Comprehensive Plan review and update has been ongoing since May 2017. The Planning Commission has discussed the Comp Plan update at 14 of its meetings over that time. The update contains the following: Modification to Vision Statement; New Section on Education; Updated Economic Development information; Update on the Coastal Resiliency section.

Chairman Crockett opened the public hearing. No one signed up or requested to speak. Mr. Crockett closed the public hearing.

On a motion made by Mr. Wolff and seconded by Mr. Phillips, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to accept the Planning Commission's recommendation on the 2018 Comprehensive Plan Review and Update (Appendix C) as outlined in a Resolution adopted by the Planning Commission on August 22, 2018, and adopts the proposed amendments, as presented.

11.3 Public Hearing to Review and Renew the Modest Town Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance

Chairman Crockett opened the public hearing. No one signed up or requested to speak. Mr. Crockett closed the public hearing.

On a motion made by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Mr. Tarr, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve the Modest Town Agricultural and Forestal district as recommended by the Agricultural and Forestal Advisory Committee on August 22, 2018 and by the Planning Commission on September 25, 2018 with the following changes:

- A) Removal of the following three parcels:
 - 1. Tax Map 56-A-48 Glenn T. Matthews: This parcel has been erroneously duplicated in two districts. It will be removed from the Modest Town Agricultural and Forestal District and retained in the Atlantic Agricultural and Forestal District.
 - 2. Tax Map 55-6-B3 Thomas Tyree & Leland Mason: removed due to land being subdivided off to a 1-acre parcel with a residence constructed upon it.
 - 3. Tax Map #70-A-99J was part of TM#70-A-99 (Gray, John): removed due to the land being subdivided off to Jason Keyes and Teresa Ward for a .34 acre lot
- B) Addition of the following four parcels that were erroneously removed from the AFD in 2014:
 - 1. Tax Map #56-A-54 Ruth Kellam & Vera T. Bruton Et Al 30.34 acres
 - 2. Tax Map #69-2-B Thomas Dix Jr., Succ TR 63 acres
 - 3. Tax Map #70-A-36 Jerry Parks & Kelly Terese Parks 30 acres
 - 4. Tax Map #79-A-126 Fletcher Barnes, III 70.033 acres
- C) Addition of the following one parcel that was created since the last review in 2014 from lands already in the AFD and it meets the criteria for inclusion
 - 1. Tax Map #79-A-136 this parcel was combined with TM#79-A-134. The original parcel of TM#79-A-134 has been in the Modest Town AFD.
- D) Change the review period for review and renewal of Agricultural and Forestal Districts to a 10-year period instead of a 4-year period.

 - * Mr. Hall submitted a letter to the Board supporting this request.
- 3. **Tax Map #93C1-A-27, 27A, 28 & 29**: Request by the Town of Onley for these parcels formerly owned by the Onley Volunteer Fire and Rescue Company
- 4. **Tax Map #79-A-37A**: Based upon prior inquiries, these parcels, which are the nursing home site on Parksley Road owned by Accomack Health Investors, LLC), are being requested for inclusion.

12. New Business

12.1 Consider Allocating Funds for a Feasibility Study for the Construction of a New Sewer Line

On a motion made by Mr. Wolff and seconded by Mr. Muhly, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to cost-share, with other stakeholders, \$10,000 towards a feasibility study of constructing a central wastewater collection system connecting the towns of Nassawadox, Exmore, Accomac and Onancock.

12.2 Receive Update on Design of New Emergency Operations Center (EOC)

Mr. C. Ray Pruitt, Director of Public Safety gave a presentation reviewing the current and future EOC. Mr. Pruitt explained that the County has been in need of and has approved the construction of a new Emergency Operations Center (EOC) which will be added to the Fire Training Center in Melfa. The new center is designed at 1,655 square feet, (1,271 square feet larger than the current EOC). The new facility will also be used as a dual training space for up to 20 students.

Currently, the EOC in Accomac is unable to accommodate the 17 emergency support functions and an information technology area; the new center is able to support both and provide the County a space to resume core functions during a state of emergency.

On a motion made by Mr. Hart and seconded by Mr. Wolff, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve the design of the new Emergency Operations Center as presented on the site plan designed by J. W. Salm Engineering and dated October 2018.

13. County Administrator's Report

13.1 Other

- 1. Mr. Mason informed the Board that Mrs. Dana Bundick, Treasurer was vetting the delinquent personal property taxes list and it would be provided to the Board at its November meeting.
- 2. He reported that VDOT had submitted results for the following:

Most of these amendments are to recognize grant awards or other non-local funds received; however, one of the amendments requires use of the FY19 budget contingency, and two others utilize undesignated fund balance in the General Fund and Consolidated EMS Fund.

On a motion made by Mr. Hart and seconded by Mr. Wolff, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve budget amendments and appropriate funds that increase revenue due to increases in grant awards from Virginia Department of Emergency Management and US Department of Homeland Security as well as fund additional emergency expenditures funded with excess revenue.
