### In Re: Call to Order

The Chairman called the meeting to order and indicated that a quorum was present.

### In Re: Invocation

The invocation was given by Mr. Trala.

### In Re: Statements from the Public

There were no statements from the public.

### In Re: Account Balances

The monthly Assistant Secretary-Treasurer's report showed an ending balance at August 31 of \$5,867.49.

### In Re: Minutes of August 2, 2011

Motion was made by Mr. Trala, seconded by Mr. Hart, that minutes of the meeting of August 2, 2011 be approved. All members were present with the exceptions of Mrs. Thornton and Mr. Wolff and voted "yes". Motion was passed.

# Management Report for Star Transit September 6, 2011

# **Operations:**

- Fuel continues to be an issue due to the fluctuation of fuel prices.
- Star continues to receive a high volume of daily calls. There were 6,682 calls this month.
- The North route is in its final stages of being completed.

Mr. McGowan indicated that the new bus will not have been delivered by the anticipated October 1<sup>st</sup> start date for the North route. A loaner bus from VRT can be arranged but the cost is not known at this time. It was the consensus of the Commission that Ms. Thornton's input be sought and brought back to the Commission for discussion/analysis at its next regular meeting (October 4<sup>th</sup>)

- GPS Tracking has been installed on three buses and is functional. This has decreased radio traffic to the buses significantly.
- STAR Transit was chosen to be a Peer Group member by the Four Square Integrated
  Transportation Planning Company as they prepare a Transit Development Plan for the
  Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) for Southampton County,
  VA. STAR's and VRT's responses will provide relevant information in the future service

- expansion in the Southampton area. STAR was chosen as a peer after DRPT shared with them STAR's successes after VRT implemented Board approved changes to the routes eighteen months ago.
- ESCC and the Town of Exmore have both sent letters agreeing to provide "in-kind match" for the construction of two Bus Shelters. The shelters have been ordered and delivery is expected within four to six weeks.
- Emergency Preparation plans were in place well ahead of Hurricane Irene. Sandbags were placed around the facility and all vehicles were moved to higher elevations on Friday evening before the storm hit. All equipment was back on property late Sunday evening and the facility was inspected for any damages or water that may have entered the building. A small puddle of water was discovered in the bay area of the garage that came down the chimney pipe and this has been addressed. It is believed that the wind was shifting the pipe causing the seal to loosen and allow water to come in. Staff did a great job preparing for the storm.

### **Ridership Statistics for August 2011**

- The ridership count for August is 5,938 passengers. This is up over last year's 3,895 for this time period.
- Ridership had been expected to plateau at some point but it is still increasing every month. August experienced another 40% increase over the previous year on the same month. With the start of school ridership is expected to increase at ESCC this year. We should begin discussions regarding increased local funding before the two counties begin their FY12-13 budget processes. This increased funding is needed to meet the growing need for additional transportation services throughout the Eastern Shore.

### **Financials**

 The Eastern Shore Community Services Board has inquired about the possibility of partnering with STAR. Staff is currently evaluating this proposal and will follow up with ANTDC Board at the Oct. 2011 meeting.

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### In Re: State's Comments

Mr. Page indicated that following the audit of STAR Transit's books, they are awaiting confirmation from Virginia Regional Transit on the final numbers. Preliminary figures indicate an overpayment to STAR of \$28,000 in operating funds and \$13,000 in capital funds. A payment arrangement, possibly over the next four fiscal cycles, will be developed.

### In Re: Railroad Comments

Mr. LeMond reported that the first float trip was made on August  $12^{th} - 3$  cars – propane and scrap metal. He also noted that the Little Creek float bridge sustained minor damages from tidal surge as a result of Hurricane Irene. Finally, Mr. LeMond noted that the pre-bid meeting was held today for the construction of the new concrete crossing at Melfa, estimated to cost \$60,000.
