3. Consideration of Minutes

3.1 February 20, 2019

On a motion made by Mr. Crockett and seconded by Mr. Wolff, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve the February 20, 2019 minutes.

3.2 March 11, 2019 – Budget Public Hearings

On a motion made by Mr. Crockett and seconded by Mr. Wolff, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve the March 11, 2019 minutes.

6. Items Removed from Consent Agenda

7. Report of Public Officials

7.1 Introduction of Mr. Dave Pierce, Acting Director of NASA Goddard Space Flight Center's Wallops Flight Facility

Mr. Wolff introduced Mr. Dave Pierce, Acting Director of NASA Goddard Space Flight Center's Wallops Flight Facility. Mr. Pierce gave a presentation of NASA Wallop's Flight Facility's Year in Review and goals for the upcoming year. Mr. Pierce also thanked the local community for its outpour of love and support during the recent government shutdown.

7.2 Receive Presentation on VIMS Mass Balance Study from Dr. Richard Snyder

Dr. Richard A. Snyder, Director of VIMS Eastern Shore Laboratory, reported that his lab had completed its study of southern Accomack County where the poultry houses are most dense. The report, titled "Water quality in southern Accomack County watersheds" states "The spatial variability in the data for all parameters and the lack of correlation of any high values to poultry sites does not suggest storm water runoff impacts from poultry operations." Mr. Snyder reports this means the existing storm water controls placed on poultry operations appear to be effectively controlling storm water.

Dr. Snyder stated that he and his team remain committed to expanding this report. The Board thanked Dr. Snyder and the Eastern Shore VIMS Lab for their commitment.

8. Committee Reports

There were no reports.

9. Old Business

9.1 Accomack Properties, Inc. Conditional Use Permit - Tax Map #93B-A-22

Mr. Morrison gave a presentation to the Board, reviewing changes that had been made to the site plans since the last time the project was presented and remanded back to the Planning Commission. On a motion made by Mr. Crockett and seconded by Mr. Phillips, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors approved the Conditional Use Permit application incorporating the Planning Commission's conditions and findings and so stating them for the record, including the preliminary site plan last revised on October 29, 2018, for Accomack Properties (CUP-2018-001) for 3 apartment buildings containing 45 units after carefully reviewing the record, including the recommendations of the Planning Commission and Staff.

The Board's decision relies on the following:

- 1. The Board of Supervisors has reviewed the materials produced by the Staff and Planning Commission, including the recommendation in this memorandum, regarding this application and makes the Planning Commission's recommended conditions part of this approval.
- 2. The Board of Supervisors agrees with the supportive reasoning outlined by the Planning Commission, as listed below, which supports the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit:

The Accomack County Planning Commission votes to recommend approval of CUP-2018-001 based upon the fact that the application meets the Standards of the Conditional Use Permit regulations as contained in Accomack County Code Section 106-234 (2). Said recommendation is based upon the Preliminary Site Plan dated November 2017, latest revision No. 5 dated October 31, 2018 and the landscaping plan which is shown on the preliminary site plan (Sheet 2 of 2) representation and assurances by the developer, and with the following conditions:

- The building materials list submitted by the applicant in January 2018 is accepted by the County and the buildings are to incorporate the same.
- The proposed renderings submitted by the applicant in January 2018 are accepted by the County and the buildings are to be constructed as shown.
- The items raised in the technical review by County staff and detailed in the Memorandum dated December 26, 2018 must be resolved in the submission of a final site plan/building permit application.
- Substantial construction of a traffic light at the intersection of Dogwood Road and Route 13 shall be required before any building permits will be issued by the County.
- The project will be constructed in substantial conformance with the site plan submitted as a market rate apartment development. The following reasons support the approval of the CUP:
 - 1. The project (Rezoning & Conditional Use Permit) has been under review for nearly a year and the Staff, Planning Commission, Board of Supervisors, and developer have worked to resolve issues and improve the project.

- 2. Market rate apartments in appropriate locations are identified in the Future Land Use Section of the Comprehensive Plan of current adoption.
- 3. The primary access point to the apartment project has been relocated westward along Dogwood Road which creates a desirable separation distance from the Dogwood Road/RT 13 intersection.
- 4. The Planning Commission has reviewed the Staff findings and review of Section 106.234(2) of the Ordinance and adopts them as the Planning Commission's findings for this Conditional Use Permit.
- 9.2 Announce Site Assessment and Planning Grant from the Virginia Brownfields Restoration and Economic Redevelopment Assistance Fund (VBAF)

Mr. Morrison informed the Board that the Building, Planning, & Economic Department staff had secured a Site Assessment and Planning Grant from the Virginia Brownfields Restoration and Economic Redevelopment Assistance Fund (VBAF), in the amount of \$50,000. He noted that the grant would be utilized, along with County funds, to cover the cost of demolition work at the Whispering Pines property. Mr. Morrison recommended that the Board consider approval of Agenda Item 9.3, to award a bid in the amount of \$185, 260.00, the additional funds would come from the Derelict Building Funds and other Current Year Budget Funds. Mr. Morrison noted that it was likely that the County would have to absorb a portion of the costs, and recoup expenses from future tax revenue generated by the future development of the property.

9.3 Consider awarding bid to demolish former Whispering Pines Hotel and other necessary work to abate the dangerous building condition.

On a motion made by Mr. Crockett and seconded by Mrs. Gordy, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to award a bid to demolish the former Whispering Pines Hotel and other necessary work to abate the dangerous building conditions, to the low bidder, Allen Clark Jr. Inc., in the amount of \$185,260, which includes an additional \$10,910 for the abatement of asbestos in a structure which was previously unidentified in the hazardous materials inspection. The former Whispering Pines Hotel and property to be demolished and abated are located at 23388 Tasley Road – Tasley, Virgnia 23441. County Tax Map #'s 86C-A-36, 86C-A-36A, 86C-A-37, 86C-A-38, 86C-A-40, 86C-2-1, 86C-2-2.

9.4 Consider Adopting the FY20 Budget, Tax Rates and Capital Improvement Plan

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE ACCOMACK COUNTY FISCAL YEAR 2020 BUDGET, FISCAL YEARS 2020-2024 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP) AND CALENDAR YEAR 2019 TAX RATES

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Accomack County Board of Supervisors to approve and control the County's Fiscal Plan for fiscal year 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility for the Accomack County Board of Supervisors to set the tax rates for calendar year 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility for the Accomack County Board of Supervisors to adopt the County's Capital Improvement Plan covering the period fiscal year 2020 to fiscal year 2024; and

WHEREAS, the notice of public hearing for the CIP was advertised in the December 29th, 2018 and January 5th, 2019 editions of the Eastern Shore Post in accordance with Section 15.2-2239 of the Code of Virginia, 1950 as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Accomack County Planning Commission has received comments on the advertised CIP from citizens of Accomack County at a Public Hearing held January 9, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Accomack Board of Supervisors has received, reviewed and adjusted the CIP for fiscal year 2020 to 2024 received on February 4th, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Accomack Board of Supervisors has received, reviewed and adjusted the County Administrator's Proposed Budget for fiscal year 2020 received February 4, 2019; and

WHEREAS, a brief synopsis of the recommended budget, tax rates and notice of public hearing was advertised in the March 1st, 2019 edition of the Eastern Shore Post in accordance with Section 15.2-2506 of the Code of Virginia, 1950 as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors has received comments on the advertised budget, advertised tax rates and advertised changes in user fees from citizens of Accomack County at a Public Hearing held on March 11, 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of Supervisors that departments and agencies shall adhere to the budgeted funds in accordance with department budgets presented by the County Administrator and adjusted by the Accomack County Board of Supervisors; and

RESOLVED by the Accomack Board of Supervisors this 20th day of March, 2019, that the following tax rates and personal property tax relief rates for Calendar Year 2019 be, and are hereby, approved as set forth in **Table 1** below; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following budgets be, and are hereby, approved and appropriated effective July 1, 2019 as set forth in **Table 2** below; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the landfill tipping fee be increased from \$75 to \$80, and is hereby, approved effective July 1, 2019; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the FY20-FY24 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) be, and is hereby, approved as set forth in **Table 3** below; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the local tax supported expenditures of the Accomack County School Division's overall budget of \$55,481,442 shall not exceed \$18,096,162 of local funds; and the entire School Division appropriation is made in lump sum as allowed by the Code of Virginia and recommended by the Virginia Department of Education; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the School Division's fiscal year 2020 local funding appropriation will be distributed to the School Division via interfund transfer initiated by the County from the County's General Fund to the School Operating Fund. The amount of aggregate transfers during the

fiscal year shall not exceed the amount appropriated by the Accomack County Board of Supervisors. The amount of transfer shall assume that all School Division expenditures eligible to be funded by non-local sources are funded by those sources ensuring that local funds are the funding source of last resort. Any remaining local appropriation at the end of the fiscal year shall revert to the General Fund. Subsequent appropriation of these funds will be guided by the County fiscal policy FP1005; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVE that no appropriation of the Accomack County School Division's prior year fund balance and/or carryover funds is granted by this resolution and that the Accomack County Board of Supervisors will consider appropriation of all prior year fund balances only when it has been determined that these funds are available for expenditure; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriations designated for County capital projects and active grants shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriations until the completion of the project or grant or until the Accomack Board of Supervisors changes or eliminates the appropriation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the additional appropriations are hereby authorized for the Law Library Fund, Courthouse Security Fee Fund, Drug Seizures Fund, Hazardous Materials Response Fund, Fire Programs Fund, Rehabilitation Projects Fund, Consolidated Fire and Rescue Fund, Consolidated Emergency Medical Services Fund, and Captains Cove/Greenbackville Mosquito Control Fund equal to the total fund balance at June 30, 2019 for each individual fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Finance Director or County Administrator be authorized to increase appropriations for non-budgeted revenue that may occur during the fiscal year as follows:

- **a)** Insurance recoveries received for damage to any county property, including vehicles, for which County funds have been expended to make repairs; and
- **b)** Virginia Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) withholding registration fees collected from taxpayers for which County funds have been expended to place the withholding registration fees; and
- c) Reimbursements made to the County for services performed by the Public Works Garage for which County funds have been expended to make said repairs.

10.1 March Appointments

Wallops Research Park Leadership Council

Mr. Wolff expressed his interest in serving, on behalf of the County, on the Wallops Research Park Leadership Council. Mr. Mason agreed to allow Mr. Wolff to serve, as his designee.

11. Public Hearing (6:30PM)

11.1 Public Hearing Rules

Mrs. Burge read the Public Hearing rules.

11.2 Public Hearing on North Landfill Expansion

Mr. Hall introduced Mr. Matt Quinan, CHA, who gave a presentation reviewing the proposed western expansion and future of the Northern Landfill, over the next 20 years. The proposed site is located at 9400 Cutler Lane – Atlantic, Virginia and contains all or parts of County Tax Map #'s 42-A-13, 42-A-14, and 42-A-15.

Chairman Hart opened and closed the public hearing as no one signed up or requested to speak.

On a motion made by Mr. Wolff and seconded by Mr. Phillips, the Accomack County Board of Supervisors voted to approve the request to apply for a permit to operate a western expansion of the Accomack County North Landfill at the proposed site of at 9400 Cutler Lane in Atlantic, Virginia (located off Greta Road), all or parts of County Tax Map #'s 42-A-13, 42-A-14, and 42-A-15.

12. New Business

12.1 Receive Presentation on the new Ditch Maintenance Program Citizen Guide

Mr. Guvernator presented to the Board a copy of the new citizen guide and website outline, to help give citizens a better understanding of the Ditch Maintenance Program, how it works and what can be expected should citizens choose to utilize the program. He noted that the guide would be available online on the County website as well as hard copy format.

Mr. Guvernator reported that he and VDOT have agreed to hold quarterly meetings to better address ditch maintenance matters County wide and increase productivity. The Board thanked Mr. Guvernator for his efforts and dedication.

12.2 2019 Annual Poultry Report Presentation from Mr. Rich Morrison

Mr. Morrison presented and reviewed key points of the 2019 Annual Poultry Report.

13. County Administrator's Report

- 13.1 Consider scheduling a special meeting to make several decisions regarding the ESPL Parksley Library Construction Project and New EOC. The Board agreed to tentatively schedule the meeting for June 5, 2019, during the normal work session.
- 13.2 Temporary reduced employee and public parking during repair work to Accomac Communications Tower during the month of April.
- 13.3 Announce cooperative agreement with Sheriff's Office to increase litter collection in the County. This new initiative pairs resources of the Sheriff's Office and County staff to collect roadside litter utilizing the County's vacuum truck and driver, along with prisoners working under the supervision of an armed deputy.

13.4 Community Corrections Grant Update – Mr. Mason reported to the Board that on February 19, 2019, the County received a letter from Mr. Rick Wilkins, Executive Director of Chesapeake Bay Alcohol Safety Action Program (ASAP) stating that as of June 30, 2019, Chesapeake Bay ASAP would no longer administer community corrections services on behalf of Accomack and Northampton County as it has over the last 12 years. Mr. Wilkins cited Chesapeake Bay ASAP was losing money providing the service.

Mr. Mason explained that this local-based probation program, which is mandated by the State and funded by a DCJS grant award, due to a reimbursement for the Regional Jail construction in 2008. Currently, the counties receive \$92,242 in Comprehensive Community Corrections Act (CCCA) state funds for these services, which may not be enough to cover the costs of the program and may lead to a request for additional funding from the counties.

Mr. Mason reported that he had been in contact with DCJS and other neighboring program administrators to build partnerships and secure resources to ensure a smooth transition of the current program overseen by Chesapeake Bay ASAP program to the County.

13.5 Delinquent Real Estate Tax Account List Certified by the Treasurer

Mr. Mason informed the Board that the Treasurer's Certified Delinquent Real Estate List would be available on BoardDocs and the County Website.

14. County Attorney's Report

Mrs. Burge apprised the Board of the status of the following Senate Bills that would directly affect the supervisors.

- 1. Senate Bill 1430 COIA (Conflict of Interest Act) Mandatory Training for the Board; and
- 2. Senate Bill 1431 FOIA (Freedom of Information Act) Mandatory Training for the Board.

- A. **Mr. Chesser** Mr. Chesser, referring to a claim in the Citizens for a Better Eastern Shore's (CBES) ShoreLine Newsletter, requested that the CBES Group retract the allegation published which stated that the current water use on the Eastern Shore is not sustainable, which is false. Mr. Chesser stated that Britt McMillan, a hydrologist for Acadia Consulting, reported that the current use is sustainable. He stated that the CBES has a moral responsibility to correct the false statement to maintain credibility.
