#### 4. MINUTES

- Chairwoman Wingfield asked if there were any changes to the minutes. Vice-Chair Roberts submitted the following changes:
  - 1. Under Determination of a Quorum", Chairwoman Wingfield was indeed present.

2. Under Remote Participation, "On a motion made by Commissioner Hickman and seconded by Vice-Chair Roberts, the Commission voted unanimously for Commissioner Pettit to participate remotely."

On a motion made by Commissioner Gayle and seconded by Commissioner Pettit, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve the June 14, 2023 minutes with the corrections.

#### 5. OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business.

#### 6. NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business presented.

#### 7. PUBLIC HEARING

HPSD Factorn Show

HRSD Eastern Shore Sewer Force Main Project- Mr. Pambid indicated that though the Staff missed the advertising deadline for a public hearing and no such hearing would take place this night, he would present a short briefing of the "2232 Review" for the HRSD Sewer Force Main- Accomac Spur, including some maps. The public hearing will be held on Wednesday, August 9, 2023.

Mr. Pambid's predecessor reported on the 2232 Review in November of 2021 for the main portion of the sewer force main project. The Planning Commission determined at that time that the project was consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. It is being conducted again for the extension from the Town of Onley up the railroad right-of-way and coming across Wharton Road, which would then connect through Front Street. The Board of Supervisors last month passed a resolution requesting the that Planning Commission do another review for this new portion of the sewer line.

Included in the packet was the Board's resolution and two maps, the minutes from the November 2021 Planning Commission meeting, and the Section 15.2-2232 of the Code of Virginia. Mr. Pambid explained that the 2232 review is intended to determine if the spur's location, character, and extent are in substantial conformance with the Comprehensive Plan. While these criteria are not defined in the state code, he suggested that:

Ш	Location means dovetailing with existing amenities, facilities and properties;
	Character means is it compatibility with the surroundings and community's goals; and
	Extent means provision of services to areas designated for future development.

For those that were present in 2021, the answers to all three were in the affirmative, that the proposed line was in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan. From the maps, he then described 1) the location of the entire facility from the Northampton/ Accomack County line all the way through to the Town of Accomac; and 2) the specific location of the proposed spur.

Planning Commissioners discussed the spur's proposed location, the locations and capacities of 8" and 4" lines, and future development areas as part of the upcoming Comprehensive Plan review to suggest more thoroughly where sewer could be provided as opposed to individual "one offs".

 Also discussed was Onancock's sewer plant capacity, which is operating at around 23%, according to Mr. Pambid's information, and sewer service for the northern end of the County. He further described the spur's location in relation to the zoning and future land use maps.

He reminded the Commission that the sewer line is for transmission, not collection of sewer.

#### 8. OTHER MATTERS

#### Comp Plan Scope

Mr. Pambid gave a similar Comp Plan overview from the same set of slides from the June meeting. He mentioned it has been recently updated back in 2018. All localities regardless of size need to have a Comprehensive Plan; it is stated in the Code of Virginia and also it states that Comp Plans have to be reviewed every 5 years. It doesn't state that it needs to be amended or revised every 5 years, just that it needs to be reviewed. Since the last amended version from 2018 was completed, nothing else has been done. No wholesale revision has taken place since then. There have been multiple discussions in the past year, and there was a memo last June and July. There were new conditions to consider since 2008 such as:

 He further noted that the current Comprehensive Plan presents data very well but is not easy to read. He expects the next iteration of the Plan to be more accommodating. He also indicated that the timing is right to also look at changes to the zoning and subdivision ordinances, which will be informed by discussions and desires from the Comprehensive Plan review.

Such a review of all three documents would require the assistance of a consultant, and funding is available in the current 2024FY budget. Next steps would include 1) additional discussion and input from the Board of Supervisors during their strategic planning session in September and 2) most likely issuing an RFP.

High level questions and consider going into the process include knowing what we want out of the next process, placemaking (community identity from a physical appearance perspective), storytelling (making the data more personal and relatable through humanizing the data), and resilience.

He indicated that there is plenty of time to shape the scope over the next few months. Commissioner Hickman said that the Commission and the Staff worked hard to de-conflict several aspects of the zoning and subdivisions ordinances, but still acknowledged that conflicts probably still exist. Commissioner Sparkman asked about planning department staffing levels, and Vice-Chair Roberts asked about including safety of the Route 13 corridor in the Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Pambid said once the RFP goes out and a consultant is selected, there will be several public participation opportunities for people to weigh in on and give their specific issues. He also suggested that the data, science, and good planning practices, while important, could let more relatable stories supported by the data take center stage.

#### **Certified Planning Commission Program**

Mr. Pambid encouraged the Planning Commission to consider the CPC. The next opening session is two days, July 27- 28 and two closing sessions September 28-29 located in Richmond. The next session is from October 12 and December 15 which would be virtual. Staff can accommodate Planning Commission if they are seeking to attend the Richmond location. #### 9. STAFF REPORTS

- Subdivision Agent The subdivision ordinance amendment regarding illegal lots will go to the Board of Supervisors the next week. Also, Mr. Pambid will be named the subdivision agent.
- Zoning Administrator –Mr. Pambid will also be named the zoning administrator. Mr. Gayle had a busy day having to attend both the BZA and Planning Commission meetings today. The BZA had 6 hearings on July 12, but have no applications for August, so they will not meet.
- Deputy County Administrator
  - o Interviews for the planner position are progressing.
  - There are still other vacancies in economic development and environmental programs.
  - The lack of an applicant pool makes filling these vacancies challenging. Local government is a worthwhile field that means something.
