# In Re: Airport Update

Mr. Wolff reported on a launch last Tuesday/Wednesday, noting that everything went

very well.

## In Re: Railroad Comments

Mr. LeMond distributed the following report:

- 1. We handled 105 cars in February for a 11 month total of 1,519 cars. Our largest shippers in February were Bayshore Concrete = 27 cars of which 18 were hi-wide nuclear cask loads; Gordon Paper = 20 cars; Sharp Energy = 16 cars; and Pep-Up with 14 cars.
- 2. The DCP Butane shipments at Little Creek have started back up after shutting down in December & January.
- 3. Forgot to mention in January, but 2014 was the Railroad's 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year without a reportable personal injury.
- 4. I have spent a lot of time the last couple of months working on VDOT's Military Highway project in Norfolk. Military is one of the busiest roads in Hampton Roads with over 70,000 vehicles a day and our trains cross it 12 to 15 times a week. This road is presently 4 lanes that will be expanded to 9 lanes. This entailed getting cost estimates for a new crossing and crossing signals; working on VDOT and construction agreements. Just the cost for the RR Projects will be \$650,000. All of this will be at VDOT's cost. Construction is to begin this Fall with completion in a couple of years.
