In Re: State's Comments

Mr. Hennessee reported that Mr. Latimer has been temporarily promoted. Additionally, he noted that the Six Year Improvement Plan has been presented to the Commonwealth Transportation Board and will be approved at the June meeting to become effective July 1st.

In Re: Airport Update

There was no report by Mr. Hart.

In Re: Railroad Comments

Mr. Parry introduced Mrs. Joyce Collins, the Assistant General Manager. He then presented the following report:

ANTDC MEETING MAY 4, 2015

- 1. In April, we handled 236 carloads. 179 of these were at Little Creek with 28 forMid-Atlantic Transload (grit), 12 for Gordon Paper and 133 handled for DCP Midstream (Butane).
- 2. In the next month we should see a considerable increase in cars for DCP Midstream since they will begin storage of product in order to load a container ship.

- 3. Three crossing signals installations have been completed and put into service. These were at Edgar Thomas Road, Wharton Road and Coal Kiln Road.
- 4. BCR has received executed VDOT agreements for the installation of concrete crossings at Ingleside and Azalea Garden Roads in Norfolk. The bid documents have gone out on these projects. All the costs for these are covered by VDOT.
- 5. Coastline Chemical's new track has been completed, inspected and put into service at New Church, VA.

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In response to a question from Ms. Major, Mr. Parry said that he had been approached by Melfa town officials with regard to refrigerated trucks which appear to be parking on railroad property in the town. This property has not been leased to anyone.

Mr. Hart asked that the 84 Lumber crossing be investigated relative to possible damage being caused by the large trucks entering at this location. Mr. Parry will research and report back to the Commission.

Lastly, it was reported that one of the Exmore rail cars has been purchased by Northampton Lumber Co. of Nassawadox and placed on display at that location.

In Re: Adjourn

Motion was made by Mr. Hart, seconded by Ms. Major, that the meeting be adjourned. All members were present with the exceptions of Mr. Hogg, Mr. Trala, and Mr. Wolff and voted "yes". The motion was unanimously passed. The meeting was adjourned.
