## In Re: Closed Session

### In Re: Railroad Comments

Mr. Parry presented the following report:

#### <u>December 1, 2015</u>

1. In November, BCR handled 301 carloads. 273 of these were at Little Creek with the top shippers being, 31 for Mid-Atlantic Transload (grit), 23 for Gordon Paper, 9 for Koch Nitrogen (Storage) and DCP (Gas Supply –Butane) 204 cars. Eastern Shore location handled the remaining

34 loads with the top shippers being Bayshore Concrete Products 7 cars, Sharp Gas 5 cars and Coastline Chemical 9 cars.
