<u>Proposed Amendment to Chapter 82, Taxation, Article IV, Transient Occupancy Tax</u>

Finance Director Michael Mason responded to questions regarding the collection of the Transient Occupancy tax and other matters relating to same.

Mrs. Thornton made a motion to hold a Public Hearing to receive public input on a proposed amendment to Chapter 82, Article IV, Transient Occupancy Tax, Sec.82-167, Tax Levy and Rate, of the Code of Accomack County, Virginia. Mr. Crockett seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Update on Reassessment

County Assessor Brent Hurdle gave a brief update on the 2012 Reassessment and responded to questions.

A discussion ensued with Mr. Hurdle and Finance Director Mike Mason responding to questions.

FY12 District Drainage Funds

Mr. Crockett offered comments regarding the Draft Policy for District Drainage Funds for use in drainage and other projects. A discussion ensued regarding drainage projects, the amount of funds allocated for projects, and the time frame in which funds should be used. Mrs. Thornton suggested that the funds be appropriated with a time frame for usage within a 2-year basis and each district only be allowed to accumulate up to \$25,000. There was discussion regarding funding, process in which projects would be approved and changes in the draft Policy Statement.

Mr. Crockett made a motion that the name of the Draft Policy Statement be renamed to "District Projects"; to adopt the draft policy developed by staff with certain changes and that 3(a) Amount - \$50,000 remain, that Public Works Director Stewart Hall will be responsible for prioritizing and executing projects within the incorporated towns and the County. Also, for the purpose of the policy that the Town of Chincoteague and Assateague be considered as a town and would receive 100% funding and the policy would be effective July 1, 2011, and to remove from f (ii) "prior to July 1 of a given year." Mr. Chesser seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Crockett thanked staff for the work done on the draft policy.

Appointments

Eastern Shore Resource Conservation and Development Council

Mr. Chesser informed members that he was resigning as Ex-Officio from the Eastern Shore Resource Conservation and Development Council.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Board of Supervisors to conserve, protect and encourage the development and improvement of the County's agricultural and forestal lands for the production of food and other agricultural and forestal products and to conserve and protect agricultural and forestal lands as valued natural and ecological resources which provide essential open spaces for clean air sheds, shellfish and fisheries production, watershed protection, wildlife habitat, and aesthetic purposes, through a mutual undertaking by landowners and the County to protect and enhance agricultural and forestal land as a viable segment of the County's economy and as an economic and environmental resource of major importance; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors is authorized pursuant to §§ 15.2-4300, *et seq.*, VA Code Ann., to create agricultural, forestal or agricultural and forestal districts; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors established the Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District for a period of four years beginning January 19, 1983; and

WHEREAS, the Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District has been renewed every four years since 1983 and the Board of Supervisors has requested the Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee and Planning Commission to review and make recommendations on renewal of the district in 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors adopted the Accomack County Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance on May 16, 2007, with the intent of incorporating the provisions of this ordinance in the creation of any new Agricultural, Forestal or Agricultural and Forestal districts and to include its provisions in each of the existing districts as they come up for renewal; and

WHEREAS, the Agricultural and Forestal District Advisory Committee reviewed the Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District on February 23, 2011, and recommended continuation of the district with the modification of properties within the district and the modification of the district conditions to include the provisions of the Accomack County Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance adopted on May 16, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission advertised a Public Meeting with the landowners in the Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District, and the Public Meeting was held by the Planning Commission on March 9, 2011, and the Planning Commission recommended continuation of the district with the modification of properties within the district and the modification of the district conditions to include the provisions of the Accomack County Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance adopted on May 16, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the attached proposed ordinance has been advertised in the Eastern Shore News, a newspaper published or having general circulation in the County, on April 9, 2011 and April 13, 2011, and a Public Hearing was held by the Board of Supervisors on April 20, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the landowners in the Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District were notified, by First Class Mail postage pre-paid, regarding the March 9, 2011, Planning

Commission Public Meeting and the April 20, 2011, Board of Supervisors Public Hearing, and provided the following information regarding the proposed modification of properties in the district and the proposed modifications to the district conditions: copy of the proposed Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance, including a list of properties in the district, a copy of the Accomack County Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance, and a copy of the current district ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the proposed ordinance will further the public health, safety and welfare of citizens of Accomack County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Board of Supervisors of Accomack County does hereby enact the attached Tasley Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance to continue such district and modify the district conditions to include the provisions of the Accomack County Agricultural and Forestal District Ordinance adopted on May 16, 2007.

Public Hearing on Chincoteague Elementary Gymnasium

Mr. Wayne Burton, Parks and Recreation Manager, reviewed with the Board cost estimates which were received for repairs to the former Chincoteague school gymnasium and responded to questions.

The Chair opened a Public Hearing to afford interested persons the opportunity to be heard or present written comments concerning the intention of the Board of Supervisors to Convey Real Property known as Chincoteague Elementary Gymnasium located on Chincoteague, Accomack County, Virginia.

The Chair recognized members of the Chincoteague Town Council in attendance.

The Chair closed the Public Hearing.

A general discussion took place with Mr. Burton responding to questions.

Mr. Gray made a motion to give the building and land to the Town of

Chincoteague and adopt the following Resolution. Mrs. Thornton seconded the motion.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ACCOMACK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, RELATIVE TO CONVEYING REAL PROPERTY KNOWN AS CHINCOTEAGYE ELEMENTARY GYMNASIUM, LOCATED ON CHINCOTEAGUE, ACCOMACK COUNTY, VIRGINIA

WHEREAS, by Deed dated August 8, 2007, and recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Accomack County, Virginia, as Instrument No. 2007 05588, Accomack County received from the County School Board of Accomack County, Virginia, certain real estate situate on Chincoteague, known as the Chincoteague Gym property located on Chincoteague Island, Accomack County, Virginia, Tax Map No. 030A5A000036900; and

WHEREAS, Accomack County desires to convey said real estate to the Town of Chincoteague; and

WHEREAS, Accomack County authorizes the County Administrator to sign the Deed and any other necessary documents to convey said property as above described.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ACCOMACK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, that the County Administrator sign the Deed and any other necessary documents to convey the Chincoteague Gymnasium Property, Chincoteague, Accomack County, Virginia, to the Town of Chincoteague. Said property more fully described and set out in said Deed.

BE IT SO RESOLVED THIS 20TH DAY OF April, 2011.

A discussion ensued.
